



OUR SYMPATHY—Retired pastor, the Rev. Ronald R. Seibert, died on October 29. Together with his wife, Maurine, Rev. Seibert served 38 years of active ministry, with 37 years in campus ministry—17 years as director of the Wesley Foundation at Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, and 20 years as director of the Wesley Foundation at Western Illinois University, retiring in 1992.
