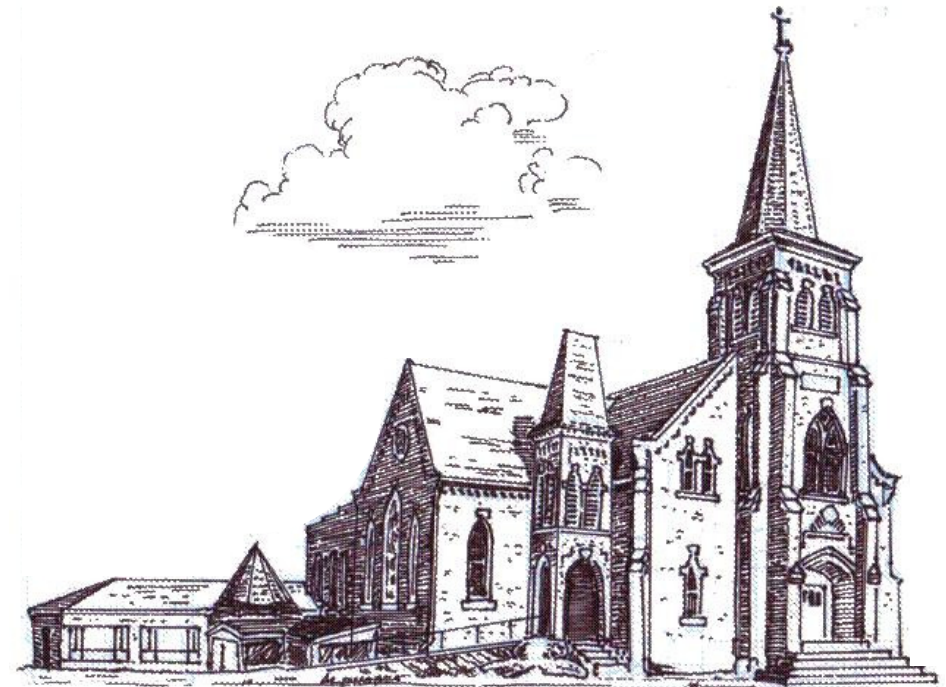

HUMAN RELATIONS DAY—We will celebrate Human Relations Day on Sunday, January 20. Human Relations Day is one of the six churchwide Special Sundays with offerings of The United Methodist Church. Human Relations Day calls United Methodists to recognize the right of all God's children in realizing their potential as human beings in relationship with one another. The special offering benefits neighborhood ministries through Community Developers, community advocacy through United Methodist Voluntary Services and work with at-risk teens through the Youth Offender Rehabilitation Program.

THANK YOU to all who contributed to the 2018 Christmas Offering. We received \$2,796.05 for this special offering!!

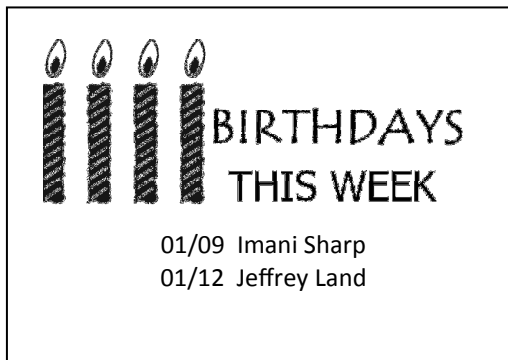
POINSETTIAS may be taken home! If you would like to have a poinsettia, please help yourself. Poinsettias not taken home today will be disposed of this week.
