



It was decided to create pledge cards just for this project, which were to be returned by last Sunday. Due to the ice event last Sunday morning, we were not able to hold morning worship. If you would like to sign a Pledge card today, they are available from the narthex, entryway and Hospitality Room. Our goal is to raise \$20,000 to have a bathroom accessible to everyone who needs it. The Board of Trustees pushed their meeting back one week, so that they can hear the results of the pledges and contributions received for this project before they make the final decision to begin this project.
