Can we find meaning in their words today? So many questions! But questions are good because they help move us toward answers that may give us a better and deeper understanding of the role of the prophets we have heard so much from in the pages of our bibles. And they may ever give us a better understanding of how they continue to speak to us today.

Over the next few weeks, we will be looking at what a prophet is and what the Old Testament prophets had to say, and what they meant at the time they said it.
