Fall Bible Study—Revival: Faith as Wesley Lived It

This seven-week small-group study will begin with an introductory evening where participants can get to know one another. Then over the course of the remaining six weeks, we will travel (via DVD) with Adam Hamilton on location to John Wesley's England, following the life of John Wesley and exploring his defining characteristics of a Wesleyan Christian. We will meet every Sunday evening from 6:00-7:30 pm at Rainbow House, beginning October 1 and ending November 12. The study includes a six-chapter book and accompanying DVD. We will distribute books during the introductory first week. Then each subsequent week, we will cover one chapter. We will watch together the accompanying video (approx. 15 minutes), discuss events from Wesley's life, ask questions, and share thoughts about how Wesley's experiences and ideas may be relevant to our faith journey today.
