

Not that I do not still have fears, but I have another arrow in my quiver to help me battle those fears. It is the reminder that I am a child of God. I have been told that my whole life, but I never really believed it. Not me. I am not good enough. I have not done enough. At best, I am a lost sheep. But wait, we are reminded that even the lost sheep is loved by the shepherd. Loved enough that the shepherd would put their own life in danger to secure the lost sheep. Could God really love me that much? Could I really qualify as a Child of God? No, I couldn't. But that's the thing, in spite of not being worthy, in spite of how much I see myself as unworthy, God still loves me. God wants to free me from my fears. Fears of not being enough, of not being worthy, of not living up to my own expectations and certainly not God's expectations of me. That is what I heard that morning as we sang those words. Through my tears, I kept singing, and more importantly believing, that I am a child of God.

Music has this way of speaking to us, of telling us about life, of touching the deepest parts of us. Music helps us express ourselves when we have no other way to do it. The Bible is full of songs that tell us about the goodness of God. But it also has songs that express our fears, our joy, our grief and many other emotions and experiences. Most of us have stories about songs that have spoken to us or maybe even given us voice. I would be very interested to hear your stories of how a song has affected you. Or how it taught you something, or encouraged you, or impacted you in some way.

I want to encourage you to tell me your stories. You can write them and send them to me, you can tell them on video and share it with me. You can catch me sometime and tell them to me yourself. They can be religious stories or just stories about life. Either way, I look forward to hearing them.






Kid's Night Out

Fall Bible Study

Revival: Faith as Wesley Lived It Led by Dawn Lambert

Overview: The 1700s were a time when English society was polarized, when the Enlightenment had led people to believe they no longer needed God, when the rich struggled with materialism, and the poor with lack of necessities. Into this world, a priest and Oxford professor named John Wesley began preaching a simple message that invited people to a passionate faith that would unite the head and the heart and the hands. His message fostered a revival of Christianity in England and across America. Today we find ourselves in a world much like Wesley's polarized, where faith seems to falter and the gap between rich and poor widens. And many of us have a faith in need of reviving.

This seven-week small-group study will begin with an introductory evening where participants can get to know one another. Then over the course of the remaining six weeks, we will travel (via DVD) with Adam Hamilton on location to Wesley's England, following the life of John Wesley and exploring his defining characteristics of a Wesleyan Christian.

Details: Every Sunday evening from 6:00-7:30 pm at Rainbow House, beginning October 1 and ending November 12. The study includes a six-chapter book and accompanying DVD. We will distribute books during the introductory first week. Then each subsequent week, we will cover one chapter. We will watch together the accompanying video (approx. 15 minutes), discuss events from Wesley's life, ask questions, and share thoughts about how Wesley's experiences and ideas may be relevant to our faith journey today.

SAK Report for 2023

What a wonderfully successful year! We pulled it together in time to have a strong start on June 5. With the support of the community, we finished the summer having *served 7,206 lunches*, averaging 167 lunches per week! That is over 2200 more lunches, more than 44%, than the summer of 2022. A huge thank you to all of our supporters, donors, and volunteers!

The Glen Ed Pantry is a great new home for SAK! As they share the same clientele that SAK tries to reach, we were able to spread the word and help more kids. A thank you to Jane Ahasy and Amy Poos at the Pantry, as well as the Pantry board and all its volunteers. The support, information, and mentoring they share with us has been very impactful. We look forward to working with them again next summer.

Looking towards the summer of 2024, and a budget of \$28,000, we are planning fundraisers, and will be reaching out to businesses and individuals for donations. It would be great to have some type of fundraising campaign this winter/Christmas. We need a group of helpers to guide this.
